Standard for Teachers' Professional Development

At the North West Learning Partnership, we understand that as we move into 2021-22 it will be more important than ever to invest in high quality Professional Development for all staff to contribute to positive pupil outcomes - improving behaviour for learning, increasing positive attitudes, and improving academic success.

Staff need dedicated PD time with experts, to determine 'What is crucial' to teach to ensure children gain a 'deep' understanding.

We do not believe that children need to 'catch up' or that there has been 'lost learning', as these statements have negative connotations. Instead, we are looking to support teachers to get ALL children 'back on track' and able to recall/retain their love of learning.

How can we do this?

The NWLP can support teachers to prioritise crucial, critical learning opportunities in all subjects.

Help to create a positive mindset, promoting a 'can do' attitude to building and reforming relationships (not only with each other, with staff but also with learning).

Teachers and pupil's mental health and well being is essential as we know that children have to be 'ready to learn' before knowledge can be imparted, transferred and retained.

Go slower, to go faster...this will be the key message through the training we offer.

Are you ready for the challenge?

We firmly believe that now is the time to take charge, and change 'our' curriculum. We are being given the freedom. Don't plan and teach for coverage. Prioritise- plan and teach what matters - **'learn less, to gain more...'**

The design of high-quality professional development is as complex a discipline as the design of high-quality teaching. All North West Learning Partnership trainers ensure planned programmes have connected activities with clarity about intended outcomes and evaluation.

Effective professional development relies upon teachers, headteachers and leadership teams in schools and organisations providing professional development, being clear about their respective roles and working together effectively.

Professional development can take many forms, but the best available evidence shows that the most effective professional development practices share similar characteristics.

Effective teacher professional development is a partnership between:

- Headteachers and other members of the leadership team
- Teachers
- Providers of professional development expertise, training or consultancy (NWLP)

In order for this partnership to be successful:

1. Professional development should have a **focus on improving and evaluating pupil outcomes**
2. Professional development should be **underpinned by robust evidence and expertise**
3. Professional development should **include collaboration and expert challenge**
4. Professional development programmes should be **sustained over time**

And all this is underpinned by, and requires that:

5. Professional development must be **prioritised by school leadership**

(DfE Standards for Teachers' Professional Development - March 2021)

The North West Learning Partnership holds the NCETM Standard for CPD Providers in Mathematics Quality Mark and works with the following partners to ensure other areas of professional development offered meets all the necessary standards: Education Endowment Fund (EEF), STEM (Science LPs), Computing Hubs, Maths Hubs/NCETM, Carnegie Centre of Excellence in Schools Mental Health and Minds ahead. In addition, all programmes are led by experts in their field to ensure the PD standards are met.

EYFS Practitioners - 'Where's the Maths in that?'

This session will look at the **new EYFS framework** and support practitioners to fully implement the new framework by building mathematical curiosity using; everyday objects, everyday events, Stories and promoting the 'right' Maths in all areas. 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Year Group Maths training sessions - 'Getting Maths Back On Track'

This course is delivered over two sessions, during the autumn and spring terms.

We will look at where children are in the autumn term and what we can do between now and March to support them.

In Session 2 we will look at progress from autumn and what we can do for to support all learners for the rest of the year moving into the next year.

Focus for the programme:

- Moderating and Standardising Maths in response to Covid recovery - curriculum prioritisation. Supporting teachers to monitor current provision, identifying gaps and planning next steps to ensure children are prepared to meet end of year national expectations
- Explore the expectation within a year group and how to teach key topics by developing practice and theory together. What does the research say, and how can we practically apply this knowledge?
- Look at ways to use manipulatives effectively by linking pedagogical knowledge to subject knowledge
- How to implement 'keep up, not catch up' strategies using assessment to identify gaps and address common misconceptions
- Support provided to narrow the gap where needed
- Support to extend the highest attaining learners
- Plan for problem solving activities explicitly
- Use Tara's toolkit resources to aid progression, transition between topics/units, terms (within year groups) and across/between year groups. Support lesson design ensuring the 'golden thread' runs throughout
- To build in peer support when developing practice, sharing expertise and learning from others

Developing Mathematical Language #‘Something to talk about’

This **two-day programme** will support teachers to plan and develop Mathematical language. With a clear and precise focus on developing Oracy skills, mathematical reasoning and problem solving. This programme will support learners to ‘think’ and ‘discuss’ resulting in a ‘Can do’ Classroom Culture where anything is possible!

We will draw on research from EEF, pedagogy from Japan, OFSTED guidance reports and Boaler to look at creating a culture to develop mathematicians so they can utilise understanding to a range of problems and make connections to real life. Pulling together the theory with practical ideas drawing on a rich evidence base. There will be a gap task between the 2 session which will provide an opportunity to experiment, reflect and share thinking.

On 13th October 2020, the Department for Education published on GOV.UK new content frameworks to support the reformed suite of National Professional Qualifications:

- **National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership**
- **National Professional Qualification for Headship**
- **National Professional Qualification for Executive Leadership**
- **National Professional Qualification for Leading Teacher Development**
- **National Professional Qualification for Leading Behaviour and Culture**
- **National Professional Qualification for Leading Teaching**

These will be available from November 2021.

Q&A

Why has the middle leadership qualification been removed?

- To decide what topics the NPQ suite should cover, DfE consulted widely with teachers and leaders across the sector to establish where there was need and demand to expand existing career pathways and development opportunities for teachers
- These conversations with the sector suggested that, with the introduction of new specialist NPQs pitched at middle leaders, there would not necessarily be demand for a generic middle leader qualification

How did DfE decide what topics the specialist NPQs should cover and what should be included in the frameworks?

- The DfE consulted widely with teachers, leaders, and sector experts to establish the areas of focus for the new, specialist NPQs. The discussions showed demand for qualifications at middle leadership level for teachers who wanted to specialise in: leading teaching or curriculum in their subject or phase; improving the behaviour of pupils and their wellbeing; supporting the professional development of other teachers
- To draft the frameworks, DfE worked closely with a wide group of sector experts. You will see that they have also been drafted to ensure coherency with the Teachers' Standards and the new Headteachers' Standards

What does this mean for people who have taken/are taking the existing NPQs?

- NPQs are a set of prestigious professional qualifications, that have been widely recognised by the sector for over 20 years. They were first introduced in 1997 with the NPQH, as part of a drive to professionalise the role of running schools, providing specific training for people wanting to become headteachers. Since then, the DfE has regularly reviewed and updated the qualifications to ensure they reflect the changing contexts of schools and latest evidence of what works. Each iteration of NPQs builds on the success of the previous ones, always recognising the achievements and abilities of those who have already earned this qualification
- The current suite of NPQs have been extended until 31 August 2022, to enable participants to complete their courses

Using a Solution Focussed Approach in Preventing Disaffection and School Exclusion

The course provides staff with Solution Focused language and structures and the resources of the Examine, Repair & Move On Approach (Murphy '93) including The Change Balloon; Scaling Walk, The Relationship Map, The Silent Session and Monitoring Charts to work with issues including:

- Low-level disruption issues
- Managing Challenging Behaviour
- Engaging the most resistant pupil and family
- Using the Approach over the telephone with attendance/ punctuality issues
- Collaborative Language with parents and pupils
- Developing a whole-school approach for Pastoral Care
- Motivating the Unmotivated Pupil and Family (3 day minimum)

The training encourages:

- Working in a more holistic, whole-person approach
- Utilising the strengths and expertise of the individual rather than acting as prescriptive experts
- Using the ethos, language and structure of the main Models, encouraging a move towards "preferred futures" rather than tracing the pathology of the problem
- Skills to help individuals to independently sustain change

The Model

The Solution Focused Approach is an evidence-based, approach that owes its origins to the psychiatrist and psychologist Milton Erickson. Holding no theory of pathology, Erickson was interested in what helped people to change – he worked with the innate abilities of each person to bring about the desired changes they envisioned.

Milton Erickson's work was harnessed by the psychotherapists Steve deShazer and Insoo Kim Berg in the 1970s to create a collaborative approach encouraging people to look at and talk about preferred futures rather than tracing the pathology of the problem – the Solution Focused Brief Therapy Model.

Often, the "stuckness" that affects people's life progress also affects recovery or the managing of low level difficulties.

The language of the *Solution Focused Approach* encourages a move from the pathology of the problem towards possibilities for improved self-care and improved coping strategies. The individual is recognized as the *expert* of their past and current experiences and it is that expertise that is utilized to identify goals and progress.

However, this approach is not about minimising problems or difficulties the person has had in the past or may still be experiencing – or about changing safeguarding practices, that would not be helpful to anyone. Neither is it an "everyone can do" motivational tool – motivation that is driven from someone other than the affected individual is hard to accept and sustain. It *is* about providing an opportunity to focus on coping strategies, personal strengths and resources and the harnessing of these in the move forward.

Conversations about “what is working” are necessary because even the most emotionally connected individual rarely question themselves about the times they do achieve any small success or progress in their lives, then further examine the **how** they achieved; the **how** they overcame difficulties and then further examine these small successes. With the model rooted in the worker’s “curiosity” rather than “analysis” the individual benefits from a worker being curious about **how** they will achieve in the future or **how** they are going to break these goals down into small self-identified, achievable targets.

The visuals and approach of the **Examine, Repair & Move On Approach** offers simple, effective tools that allow for all to be heard and for setting of small, action based tasks.

The components of this resource, devised by the Consultancy, are used widely within Social Care, Education and Mental Health.

The framework also includes **The Silent Session** (E.Murphy ’06) an approach, devised by Eileen Murphy when working with clients who did not wish to disclose or who are unable to verbalise their issue. This resource is used extensively across diverse fields including Mental Health and allows for a totally non-intrusive session with the client focusing more on “hearing” the answers for themselves rather than being distracted by “translating” or “editing” their responses for the Worker.

Foundation Subjects

History

Session 1: history as a discipline

In a recent article in the Primary History Journal, Tim Jenner (OFSTED lead inspector for history) said that primary teachers are getting far better at teaching the substantive knowledge required to understand the past. An area that requires more development is the teaching of history as a subject discipline. This session introduces delegates to the importance of this aspect of history teaching. It will feature a mixture of support to incorporate into planning across school and for individual units of work then what the teaching can look like in classrooms from EYFS to Year 6.

Session 2: embedding maths

This session is based around the role maths can play as a tool to understand the past. The initial focus will be the direct link between mathematical understanding and the chronological narrative children are expected to construct as their understanding of the past increases over time. The second aspect is making use of evidence to develop children's understanding of the past by making use of number-driven sources such as census returns and statistics. An emphasis will be placed on ensuring that the historical understanding is developed using maths to promote understanding and interpretation.

Session 3: embedding English

If we are not careful, history can turn into another English lesson where the marking, outcomes and understanding are not on history. The purpose of this session is to use history as a vehicle to apply English skills and concepts on to using classroom tested approaches that always promote a greater understanding of the past. This includes adverbs linked to chronology, applying reading 'skills' to engage more deeply with source material and the importance of an evidence-led answer to enquiry questions.

- Up to date guidance and advice based on research and classroom experience
- Takeaways that can be applied into every classroom with minimal adjustments to teaching
- Modelled sessions to ensure they are fully briefed on the what/how and why to embed each of the sessions

Early Career Framework (ECF)

The Early Career Framework (ECF) underpins an entitlement to a fully funded, two-year package of structured training and support for early career teachers linked to the best available research evidence. The package of reforms will ensure new teachers have dedicated time set aside to focus on their development. The DfE's vision is for the ECF to build on high-quality Initial Teacher Training (ITT) and become the cornerstone of a successful career in teaching.

The ECF underpins what all early career teachers should be entitled to learn about and learn how to do based on expert guidance and the best available research.

The ECF focuses on 5 key areas:

- Behaviour management
- Pedagogy
- Curriculum
- Assessment
- Professional behaviours

DfE Funding

The DfE is providing funding for:

- An additional 5% off new teachers teaching timetable in their second year of induction
- Additional funding to backfill mentor time spent undertaking training in addition to the funding for time off timetable

The funding amount is calculated by taking the average salary of mentors and early career teachers, split by region.

Schools can engage at the following levels:

Option 1: School Led Induction Programme Design own two year induction programme based on the Early Career Framework.

Option 2: Core Induction Programme Deliver own induction programme using high quality materials and resources, accredited by the DfE.

Option 3: Full Induction Programme Use a lead provider to support meeting the new statutory induction requirements

The NWLP will support Teaching School Hubs in association with BPN License (Option 3) to deliver the programme.
